Therefore schools in South Sudan will now operate normally in the academic year 2024 which will begin in February and will end in December. The examinations for candidate classes of P8 and S4 will be conducted from Mid-November to Mid-December of the same year.

The booklet is primarily prepared to inform the State Ministries of Education, County and Payam Education Offices, Head Teachers and teachers on the implementation of the Academic Year 2024.

The Ministry of General Education and Instruction (MoGE&I) would like to thank the School Technical Working Group (TWG) for the valuable work it has been undertaking. The Ministry would also like also to thank its partners for their active participation in discussions and support for the Technical Working Group.

Copies of the booklet will be distributed to the State Ministries of Education (SMoE), County Education Departments (CED) and Payam Education Offices (PEO) and schools guide them in implementation of 2024 academic calendar. I urge all stakeholders including education partners to support the implementation of the calendar.

By doing so we can together support teachers to start classes in the required date of Academic Year 2024 which ensure the completion of the syllabus for quality learning and better performance of the learners.

## Executive Summary

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Though COVID-19 pandemic had disrupted the South Sudan Academic Calendar in the past three consecutive years, the Ministry of General Education and Instruction had normalized the academic calendar because the cases of COVID-19 pandemic gone down in the region and in South Sudan in particular which is from February to December. Therefore, the academic calendar of 2024 will begins on Monday the 5<sup>th</sup> February and ends on the 20<sup>th</sup> December.

These guidelines are meant to guide the State Ministries of Education, County and Payam Education Offices, as well as Head Teachers and teachers, on the implementation of the Academic Calendar of the Year 2024.

## Arrangement of learning

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In the Academic Year 2024 classes will begin on Monday the 5<sup>th</sup> February and end on the 20<sup>th</sup> December, learners will be promoted to the next class based on their performance.

## Management of class overcrowding

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Recommended class sizes for Pre-primary, Primary and secondary are based on MoGEI minimum standard where twenty (20) learners in Pre-primary class, fifty (50) learners in primary class and forty five (45) learners in secondary class, and this is in line with the MoGEI policy.

Class larger than 50 learners in Primary or 45 learners in Secondary must be divided into streams of up to 50/45 learners to maintain quality of learning and physical distancing of the learners in each classroom while learners more than 20 in each Pre-primary classroom must be divided into streams.

## Registration of learners with disabilities and functional difficulties

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Learners with disabilities and functional difficulties have the right and shall be permitted to register in a school of their choice. This will typically be a school closest to their

residence. All schools which will register learners with disabilities and functional difficulties, and which require support to arrange learning process for these learners, shall work closely with their PTA's, SMC's/BoG's, PES and Disability Champions to rapidly achieve that. All learners with disabilities and functional difficulties shall start attending lessons on Monday the 5<sup>nd</sup> February 2024 just like all other learners.

## Implementation of the New South Sudan Curriculum

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Upon school opening Pre-primary, Primary and Secondary classes will follow the New South Sudan Curriculum.

The medium of instruction in pre-primary and from P1 to P3 classes is a national language selected by the school. The medium of instruction from P4 to S4 is English. National languages will continue to be taught as subjects from P4 to P8.

## Safeguarding, psychosocial support and wellbeing

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School staff, SMC/BoG, PTA members, school mothers, mentors and teachers shall pay additional attention to psychological needs of learners who are returning to school distressed, due to various causes shall be supported and provided with access to a mentor or a school mother.

Schools shall introduce a zero-tolerance policy and child friendly strategies for reporting and tackling bullying, corporal punishment, gender-based violence (GBV) and discrimination. All school-based violence shall be condemned.

Learners should be mentored through difficult situations they are experiencing and provided with support to stop bullying behaviours. There is zero-tolerance for bullying behaviours in schools.

Teachers are forbidden from using corporal punishment and any form of violence, discrimination and intimidation.

## Health and hygiene

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- 1) All learners and school communities shall be enlighten on Health and Hygienic measures to avoid being affected by diseases that are caused by not following the correct health and hygienic measures.
- 2) All school staff and learners must be enlightened on the importance keeping school environment clean hand washing protocols.
- 3) Clean water and soap for washing hands must be provided in all schools. Staff and learners should wash their hands before and after having food and after using toilets.

## School compound and school environment

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- 1) School compound and all school infrastructures, inclusive of buildings and furniture, must be sufficiently aired.

- 2) Cleaned prior to school opening and daily after the school opens.

## Timetable for assemblies and parades

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- 1) School assemblies and parades are to be conducted normally based on master time table.
- 2) Sport and extra-curricular activities are to be conducted normally based on master time table.

## Food, utensil and drinking water

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- 1) Schools with a school-feeding programme shall follow the safety measures set by the Ministry of Health and communicated separately by WFP or other partner supporting the school feeding.
- 2) Learners should be guided to keep food, drinks, utensils, cups, bottles, and other personal items clean to avoid diseases caused by poor hygienic habits.

## Guidance on 2024 Academic Calendar

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- To enable fulfilment of the New South Sudan Curriculum within the directives of the General Education Act 2012, the school week in the Academic Year 2024 will be **a five** days a week and will run from Monday to **Friday**. School holidays and the school year both will be normal and Public Holidays will be observed.

- The MoGE&I has set the start date of the 2024 Academic Year will be on Monday the **5<sup>th</sup> February 2024** and end on 20<sup>th</sup> December 2024. Approximately, there will be **203 instruction** days in the Academic Year 2024. Learners will undergo their termly examinations at the end of each term,
- **Term 1** will begin on Monday the **5<sup>th</sup> February 2024** and will end on Friday the **10<sup>th</sup> May, 2024** with **67** instruction days. There will be two-week breaks which will be from Saturday **11<sup>th</sup> May and ends on Friday the 24<sup>th</sup> May 2024**. There will be school-based in-service training (CPD) during the holidays and training will be for ten (10) working days.
- **Term 2** will begin on **Monday the 27<sup>th</sup> May, 2024 and end on Friday the 6<sup>th</sup> September, 2024** with **71** instructional days. There will be two-week breaks between Saturday the **7<sup>st</sup> September, 2024 and ends on Friday the 22<sup>nd</sup> September, 2024**. There will be school-based in-service training (CPD) during the holidays and training will be for ten (10) working days.
- **Term 3** will begin on **Monday the 23<sup>th</sup> September, 2024 and end on Friday the 20<sup>th</sup> December 2024** with **65** instruction days. There will be school-based in-service training (CPD) during the holidays and the training will be for ten (10) working days.
- Candidate classes of P 8 and S4 will undertake their final examinations in November-December 2024. The Examinations calendar for Candidate classes will be published separately.

**NB: National Examination Secretariat should ensure that the examination for P.8 and senior 4 candidates are conducted within November through December 2024.**
